3. CORE ACTIVITIES

3.1. School Support Programs

- Renovate classrooms and provide furniture to public primary and junior secondary schools
- Supply instructional materials (books, writing materials, teaching aids)
- Target at least 2 schools per ward annually

3.2. Student Incentives & Scholarships

- Establish scholarship schemes for academically gifted students from underprivileged backgrounds
- Provide learning materials for vulnerable students
- Recognize academic excellence through awards

3.3. Literacy Promotion

- Organize adult literacy classes across all 15 wards
- Establish community reading corners in collaboration with schools
- Promote reading culture through book clubs

3.4. Enrollment Campaigns

- Conduct annual "Back-to-School" campaigns before each academic session
- Target girl-child enrollment and retention
- Address barriers to education through community dialogue

3.5. Teacher Support

- Organize periodic workshops for teachers on modern teaching methods
- Teacher appreciation events to boost morale
- Advocate for teacher welfare and professional development
